Happy 2014 East Lake!

I hope you're all enjoying this beautiful Spring in East Lake. Just as the blooms start popping so does the neighborhood, which is one of my favorite things about living here. We had a super fun, if belated, Easter Egg Hunt in East Lake Park sponsored by Uncle Maddio's Pizza. The kids had a blast collecting more than 1000 stuffed eggs in a fraction of the time it took to put them out. It was so nice to see several new faces and, of course, the Easter Bunny! Also now and ongoing is the Community Learning Garden, the Urban Farm, the Farmers Market (which has moved to Tuesday evenings), and Wind Down Wednesdays.

As we move forward with traditional and new activities, we've now got a blueprint to guide us in our community work. For the past year and a half, a volunteer team worked to create a future vision for East Lake as seen through the community's eyes. We talked with representatives from the groups working in the neighborhood, including Neighbor In Need, the East Lake Foundation, the Villages of East Lake, the East Lake Schools Coalition, NPU-O, the East Lake Easy Goers and many more. We connected with our schools and houses of worship. We created a way for neighbors to share their thoughts directly and we hosted three group sessions to brainstorm, categorize and

prioritize ideas. Six areas of interest emerged: Community Engagement, Education, Health and Nutrition, Safety, Seniors, and Children and Youth.

Out of all this work came a Community Action Plan (CAP) that includes specific tasks, who's going to lead them and by when. The plan is a working document in that we anticipate new ideas will emerge and that those ideas, too, will turn into action. Additionally, some actions are ongoing, such as the Tri-Jurisdictional Safety Task Force between the Atlanta Police Department, DeKalb Sheriff's Department and Decatur Police Department. Others are one-time events, such as launching an updated website or producing an accurate map of East Lake boundaries. Please visit East Lake's website (www.eastlake.org) for a copy of the CAP.

Another useful document that came out of the Visioning process was a Resource Guide, which lists our community's organizations, recreation outlets, schools, houses of worship and businesses. Just like the CAP, we anticipate this information will grow and change over time. So please let us know what ideas and resources you want to see included by emailing eastlakevisioning@gmail.com.

State of Education

One of the areas of priority that emerged from the Visioning Project is education. We've got a lot happening on the education front in East Lake right now, some amazingly positive and some big challenges.

It's hard to miss the beautiful new Drew Charter Senior Academy being constructed at 2nd Avenue and Memorial Drive. It's scheduled to open this summer and will house students in 6th through 10th grades in the 2014-15 school year. An additional grade will be opened in each of the following two years: 11th grade in the 2015-16 school year and 12th grade in 2016-17.

Drew Charter Senior Academy will be state of the art, with expansive wifi coverage, laptops for all students and a "genius bar" where they can get the computers serviced. The facility features a beautiful indoor theater, outdoor amphitheatre and running track, all of which will be open to the community for special events and exercise.

Maynard H. Jackson High School is another spectacular piece of the area's educational renaissance. After being temporarily housed at Coan Middle School, the International Baccalaureate World School recently reopened to a stunning \$40 million renovation that includes a new media center, rooftop garden, gym, performing arts spaces, athletic fields and more.

Toomer Elementary has had a successful second year after merging with East Lake Elementary. The first year held some challenges, but things have smoothed out, allowing teachers and faculty to focus on the small school, family-feel approach they champion. Toomer is our traditional elementary school, housing 18 pre-K

through 5th grade classrooms and boasts that 68% of faculty holds advanced degrees, with 11 years of teaching on average. Oh, and they're in their seventh year of full immersion Mandarin Chinese instruction. Wow!

On the middle school front, we are again experiencing change. Just recently, the Atlanta Public School Board of Education (BOE) voted to merge Coan into King Middle School, effectively closing Coan. The joined middle school population will be housed at Coan for the next two school years while King is renovated and then it will relocate to King. Both schools have been underpopulated for some time, which created a multitude of problems; the BOE felt this was the best solution. What it means for East Lake is that our traditional school students and their families will face relocation from East Lake Elementary where they are now, back to Coan and then to King in two years. They will not be able to walk to school after they move to King and we will have another empty school building (in addition to East Lake Elementary) on this side of town. We hope that the combined student body will bring all the support services every successful school enjoys, as well as robust athletics programming and strong community support.

Schools are a critical thread in the fiber of any community, and whether or not you have school-aged children, you are affected by the tides of education. With all these goings-on in our schools, it is hard to keep up with the changes, which will hopefully be minimal in the future so we can focus on all the positive growth around us.

4. What do you like best about living here?

The Shoal Creek Class at Turning Sun School, and Our Relationship with the East Lake Community Learning Garden by Whitney Hansen

For Turning Sun's inaugural year at our East Lake location, my co-teacher and I developed a central question to guide our year long class project: How do children grow when they develop a deep relationship with a local community space? We began by researching place-based education and locally rooted learning. Through this lens we quickly discovered the East Lake Community Learning Garden. My co-teacher and I had never visited the Garden, despite living within walking distance. After one visit, we knew it was the right community space for Turning Sun families to explore and connect with. Khari Diop (president of the Garden) and Deneah Lopes (director of animal relations) visited our school, bringing Django, a goat, and Cinderella, a chicken. We made books about the animals and talked about them during morning meetings. For our first field trip to the Garden, families walked together from our school. We shared morning

meeting, greeted the chickens in the coop, and listened as Khari read a book. Visits to the school and Garden have been ongoing. The children have made "pupcakes" for Peri the dog, presented Khari with a "Local Community Hero" cape, and won the ELF Market Collard Green Cook-Off (amateur division).

We have reached the end of our year. To celebrate the deep relationship that has grown between Turning Sun families and the Garden, we will hold a classroom festival. The children are planning the decorations, making decisions for what we sell at our classroom ELF Market table, and creating a Peri-sized dog house for the classroom. The school is now also a part of the Garden advisory committee. As educators, we are inspired by their love for this wonderful community space and plan to continue growing and deepening our relationship over time.
